1. FOREWORD

Statistical data on perpetrators of criminal offences and perpetrators of misdemeanours are based on the official data provided by the Ministry of Justice and the State Attorney's Office of the Republic of Croatia. The data on offenders comprising infringements of intellectual property rights relate to the persons as reported, accused and convicted. The methodology includes final decisions issued by the State Attorney's Offices on reports of criminal offences, as well as final court decisions. The data on the misdemeanants relate to natural persons accused and to those found guilty in the misdemeanour procedure, as well as to legal persons found responsible for a misdemeanour comprising infringements of intellectual property provisions. The methodology includes final decisions taken by the misdemeanours' courts.

Data provided by the Ministry of the Interior for the period up to 2010 relate to the number of criminal reports filed related to crimes infringing intellectual property rights. Since 1 January 2011, the data on the number of criminal offences as committed and the number of persons reported for such criminal offences have been monitored.

Data provided by the Ministry of Finance – Customs Administration concerning measures at the border relate to the number of procedures instituted *ex officio* and the number of procedures instituted upon the rights holder's request. In addition to this, the presentations have been made of data on the goods as destroyed, data on the stay of proceedings, and data on the cases pending before courts. The stay of proceedings relates to the cases in which the right holder, after detention of goods, failed to initiate further proceeding due to the fact that it was established that those goods were original (genuine) or the right holder had no interest in taking measures for the protection of his/her right notwithstanding that counterfeit goods were concerned. Data on the value of goods expressed in EUR, as well as the number and type of products are presented. Since 1 January 2009, the Customs Administration has not monitored the value of the goods as declared, but has monitored the value of the destroyed counterfeit goods represented as a retail price of such original goods on the Croatian market, expressed in EUR.*

* The statistical data on the infringements of intellectual property rights in the Republic of Croatia, as presented in this report, have been processed in accordance with the existing methodology developed following the requests having arisen from the negotiation process for the accession of the Republic of Croatia to the full membership in the European Union. The Republic of Croatia became a full member of the European Union on 1 July 2013, which abolished a formal

As of 1 January 2014, the tasks under the responsibility of the State Inspectorate referring to the enforcement of intellectual property rights, in compliance with the Act on Amendments to the Act on Organization and Scope of Work of Ministries and Other Central State Administration Bodies (NN/Official Gazette 148/13), were assumed by the Ministry of Finance – Customs Administration. In compliance herewith, the Customs Administration monitors the implementation of the provisions in the field of intellectual property in the internal market of the Republic of Croatia, by conducting inspection *ex officio* and on the basis of reports filed by natural and legal persons. The data in this report relate to the number of inspections carried out by inspectors of the Customs Administration, and the number of indictments for initiating a misdemeanour procedure and misdemeanour warrant with respect to any individual infringement of intellectual property rights as filed. Moreover, the data were presented on the type and number of provisional seizure of goods due to the infringements of trademark provisions (counterfeits).

Since 2014, the data on inspections carried out under the responsibility of the Ministry of Agriculture have been monitored as well. The inspections relate to the supervision of production and trade of agricultural products and foodstuffs, products in the sector of winemaking and the sector of spirits protected by designations of origin and geographical indications. The data presented include the number of inspections carried out in this field of protection and the number of misdemeanours stated.

The data provided by the Ministry of Justice refer to criminal and misdemeanour procedures, the procedures before four commercial courts having jurisdiction and the High Commercial Court of the Republic of Croatia, the procedures before four administrative courts having jurisdiction and the High Administrative Court of the Republic of Croatia, including the mode of their settlement and duration of the judicial procedures.

obligation to submit this statistical report to the European Commission. Upon the decision of the Steering Committee for the Enforcement of Intellectual Property Rights, statistical data on the infringements of intellectual property rights shall be kept on being monitored via this report in order to monitor the efficiency of intellectual property rights enforcement system on a national level.

Since the new Criminal Code of the Republic of Croatia came into effect on 1 January 2013 (NN/Official Gazette 125/11, 144/12, 56/15, 61/15 and 101/17; hereinafter: CC), which has brought certain differences in the legal descriptions themselves of criminal acts and their terminology related to the regulations as previously in effect, the data provided by the Ministry of the Interior, the State Attorney's Office and the Ministry of Justice (for criminal courts) are presented individually in tables, by periods in which individual regulations were implemented.



For easier comparison of these data and monitoring of criminal procedure progress from 2013 onwards, let us mention that in relation to some of these criminal offences one can speak of legal continuity existing between criminal offences from the earlier CC and criminal offences provided by the new CC. However, the new CC does not provide for criminal law protection of industrial design, whereas industrial design as one of industrial property rights within earlier provisions was protected as provided by Article 285 CC.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

MINISTRY OF FINANCE – CUSTOMS ADMINISTRATION

Measures at the border

In 2017, the Customs Administration initiated a total of 807 procedures concerning the shipments of goods suspected of infringing intellectual property rights, 2 (0.25%) out of which were initiated *ex officio* and 805 (99.75%) upon the right holder's request. Out of 807 procedures in total, 777 (96.28%) refer to small shipments (by courier or post). The goods were destroyed in 776 cases and released in 29 procedures, while the goods in 2 procedures have been waiting for a court decision.

According to the type of the goods suspected of infringing certain intellectual property rights in respect of which procedures were initiated, the majority of goods were from the following three groups:

- Toys, games and sports equipment 34,326 pcs (38%)
- Footwear 33,330 pcs (37%)
- Body care products (perfumes and cosmetics) 15,895 pcs (18%)

As regards cases decided in 2017, a total of 35,139 counterfeited products were destroyed of the aggregate retail value of EUR 599,459.77.

Statistical data comparison for 2016 and 2017

Comparing the years 2016 and 2017, the aggregate number of procedures initiated by the Customs Administration decreased in this field of protection from 1,229 in 2016 to 807 in 2017, namely by 34%, whereby the number of procedures initiated upon the right holder's request decreased from 1,207 to 805 (by 33%), and the number of procedures initiated *ex officio* decreased from 22 to 2 (by 91%). The number of procedures under which the products were destroyed decreased from 1,151 in 2016 to 776 in 2017, namely by 33%. The total amount of the retail value of the seized and destroyed counterfeited goods decreased from EUR 2,067,169.48 in 2016 to EUR 599,459.77 in 2017, namely by 73%.

Inspection in the internal market

During 2017, inspectors of the Customs Administration carried out a total of 619 inspections in the internal market related to the protection of intellectual property rights, out of which 296 inspections (48%) resulted in serving indictments for initiating a misdemeanour procedure or issuing misdemeanour warrant. 3 criminal charges were filed due to infringements of trademark provisions.

In the number of inspections as carried out, there were 365 inspections (59%) referring to the protection of copyright and related rights, and 254 (41%) to the inspections relating to the protection of industrial property rights (trademark and industrial design).

Out of 296 submitted motions to indict and misdemeanour warrants issued, there were 130 (44%) referring to the infringements of copyright and related rights, and 166 (56%) to industrial property rights infringements.

The aggregate value of the products temporarily seized by the Customs Administration in the internal market of the Republic of Croatia in 2017, due to the infringements of the provisions covering the field of intellectual property rights, accounted for EUR 1,693,415.20. The value of the products seized due to the infringements of the provisions on copyright accounted for EUR 12,157.80 and EUR 1,681,257.40 due to the infringements of the provisions on industrial property (trademark and industrial design).

In 2017, the Customs Administration temporarily seized 227,848 different kinds of products due to the infringement of trademark provisions. These were mostly the products from these three main groups:

- Clothes and clothing accessories 62,712 pcs (28%)
- Personal accessories 59,139 pcs (26%)
- Toys, games and sports equipment 50,461 pcs (22%).

In addition to the aforementioned, inspectors of the Ministry of Agriculture carried out a total of 305 inspections during 2017 of the production and trade of products related to the protection of geographical indications and designations of origin of agricultural products

and foodstuffs and products in the sector of winemaking and spirits. Upon inspections conducted, there were 44 misdemeanours committed, 25 indictments served and 12 misdemeanour warrants issued.

Statistical data comparison for 2016 and 2017

Comparing the years 2016 and 2017, the aggregate number of inspections carried out decreased from 692 to 619, namely by 11%, and the number of indictments for initiating a misdemeanour trial and misdemeanour warrant served decreased from 509 to 296, namely by 42%.

In the same period, there was a decrease in the share of inspections as well that resulted in initiating misdemeanour procedures, from 74% in 2016 to 48% in 2017.

The aggregate number of temporarily seized products due to the infringements of the trademark provisions was on the increase, from 45,493 in 2016 to 227,848 in 2017 (by 401%), as well as the aggregate value of temporarily seized products, from EUR 677,341.10 in 2016 to 1,528,841.40 in 2017, namely by 126%.

Furthermore, when carrying out the inspection of passenger transport, commercial quantities of products were found with 3 natural persons and there was reasonable doubt created that the contested products presented offence committed pursuant to the Trademarks Act, so that misdemeanour trial was initiated against the owner, i.e. 3 misdemeanour warrants were issued. 546 pieces of various products were found in total under category of clothing and sportswear, in the total value of EUR 6,236.00.

As to the data by the Ministry of Agriculture on the implementation of inspections of the protection of geographical indications and designations of origin, comparing the years 2016 and 2017, it is evident that there was a decrease in inspections conducted, from 411 inspections in 2016 to 305 inspections in 2017, namely by 26%. The number of offences established in inspections conducted substantially increased from 20 in 2016 to 44 in 2017 (by 120%).

MINISTRY OF THE INTERIOR

In 2017, the Ministry of the Interior reported 5 adult persons for having committed a total of 82 criminal offences against intellectual property, out of which 1 person was reported for having committed 2 criminal offences of copyright and related rights infringement and 4 persons for having committed 80 criminal offences of infringement of industrial property rights (in all of the eighty cases it was a matter of trademark infringements). There was no report for a criminal offence of infringing the invention right nor of infringing the registered appellation of origin in 2017.

Statistical data comparison for 2016 and 2017

In 2017, the number of persons reported to have committed criminal offences against intellectual property decreased, from 7 in 2016 to 5 in 2017, whereas the aggregate number of criminal offences increased from 8 in 2016 to 82 in 2017, namely by 925%.

STATE ATTORNEY'S OFFICE

In 2017, 52 infringers were reported to the State Attorney's Office for having committed criminal offences against intellectual property, out of which 22 infringers were reported for having committed criminal offences against copyright and related rights (42%), and 30 for infringement of industrial property rights (58%).

The State Attorney's Office passed decisions against 31 perpetrators reported for infringing intellectual property rights. Indictments were filed against 4 perpetrators reported for infringing intellectual property rights (13%), 24 criminal reports were rejected (77%). Taking of evidence was required in 3 cases, and 16 cases remained unresolved. Perpetrators in 5 cases remained unknown.

Statistical data comparison for 2016 and 2017

Comparing the years 2016 and 2017, the number of reported infringers of intellectual property rights remained almost the same (53 infringers reported in 2016 and 52 in 2017).

The number of reported infringers of copyright and related rights decreased from 36 to 22, namely by 39%, whereas the number of reported infringers of industrial property rights increased from 17 in 2016 to 30 in 2017, namely by 76%.

The number of indictments for the infringements of intellectual property rights decreased from 6 in 2016 to 4 in 2017, and the number of rejected criminal reports decreased from 25 in 2016 to 24 in 2017.

JUDICIARY

Criminal Courts

According to the data by the Ministry of Justice, in 2017, 19 persons were accused of having committed criminal offences against intellectual property, out of which 5 persons (26%) were accused of infringing copyright or related rights, and 14 persons (74%) of infringing industrial property rights.

Out of 19 persons in total accused of committing criminal offences against intellectual property, 13 persons (68%) were found guilty (2 persons were found guilty of infringing copyright or related rights, and 11 persons of infringing trademark rights). The courts delivered also 4 verdicts of release.

During 2017, there were no unconditional prison sentence imposed with this kind of criminal offences, 9 persons were imposed a conditional prison sentence, and 2 unconditional fines were imposed as well.

Statistical data comparison for 2016 and 2017

Comparing the years 2016 and 2017, the total number of persons accused of criminal offences against intellectual property slightly increased, from 18 to 19. In 2017, as well as in the previous year, the most persons were found guilty of having committed criminal offences of trademark infringement.

Misdemeanour Courts

In reporting, as proposed by the Ministry of Justice, there was a change in methodology introduced since 2017, so that every defendant is statistically recorded as many times as many offences they committed (every case or procedure is recorded separately, although committed by the same infringer).

In 2017, misdemeanour procedures were initiated against 10,503 natural or legal persons due to infringements of copyright provisions. Consequently, 5,916 persons (56%) were found guilty of or responsible for having committed a misdemeanour offence. 3,667 natural and 1,969 legal persons were imposed a fine in a misdemeanour procedure.

Misdemeanour procedures were initiated against 97 natural or legal persons in total due to infringements of trademark and industrial design provisions. 71 persons (73%) were found guilty of or responsible for having committed a misdemeanour offence, out of which 54 natural and 14 legal persons were imposed a fine.

Statistical data comparison for 2016 and 2017

Due to changes in the methodology of keeping records introduced by the Ministry of Justice in 2017, the comparison with the data from the previous year is redundant.

THE NUMBER OF COURT CASES AND DURATION OF PROCEDURES

Administrative Courts

On 1 January 2017, the competent administrative courts had 16 pending cases in the field of industrial property rights. During 2017, 32 new cases were received, and 3 cases were decided (1 case within 6 to 12 months, 1 case within 1 to 2 years and 1 within 3 to 4 years), so that 45 cases were pending at the end of the reported period. Claims were rejected in all of the three resolved cases.

High Administrative Court of the Republic of Croatia

At the beginning of 2017, there were no pending cases at the High Administrative Court of the Republic of Croatia, and during 2017 there were 2 cases received in the field of industrial property rights. The claim was rejected in one resolved case (the case was decided within 3 months), and there was one case pending at the end of the period.

Commercial Courts

On 1 January 2017, the competent commercial courts had 727 cases pending in the field of intellectual property rights. During 2017, 502 new cases were received, and 761 cases were decided (63% out of the cases pending in total). On 31 December 2017, 468 cases before commercial courts were pending in the field of intellectual property rights.

The largest number of cases received at commercial courts during 2017 referred to the field of collective management of copyright (80%), followed by cases in relation to individual management of copyright (15%), trademark right (3%) and an insignificant number of cases in other fields of intellectual property.

In 2017, the majority of cases in the field of intellectual property rights decided at the competent commercial courts (67%) was decided within less than a year, the largest number of which was decided within 3 to 6 months (194 cases, namely 25%).

High Commercial Court of the Republic of Croatia

On 1 January 2017, the High Commercial Court of the Republic of Croatia had 335 cases pending in the field of intellectual property rights. During 2017, 121 new cases were received, and 140 cases were decided (31% out of the cases pending in total). On 31 December 2017, there were 316 pending cases in the field of intellectual property rights.

In 2017, 40% of the cases was decided by this court within the period of 2 to 3 years, 21% of the cases within the period of 3 to 4 years and 14% of the cases within the period of 3 months.

Criminal Courts

In 2017, a total of 19 persons were accused at criminal courts of criminal offences against intellectual property.

As to the duration of a criminal procedure from filing of an indictment to a final court decision, it is evident from the data that most of cases were decided within 12 months (75%).

Misdemeanour Courts

In 2017, a total of 10,600 natural and legal persons were accused at misdemeanour courts of infringing intellectual property provisions, out of which 5,987 persons were found guilty of or responsible for the misdemeanour committed, and the procedure was suspended in relation to 343 defendants. Protection measures were imposed on 1 person.

As to the duration of a misdemeanour procedure from misdemeanour reports to a final court decision, it is evident from the data that the largest number of cases during 2017 was decided within 12 months (5,043 cases, namely 78%).

2. CRIMINAL LAW AND MISDEMEANOUR LAW PROTECTION – COMPREHENSIVE COURSE OF ACTION UNDER CRIMINAL AND MISDEMEANOUR PROCEDURES

2.1. Comprehensive course of action of a criminal procedure from filing a criminal report until the criminal court decision in 2017

In 2017, the Ministry of the Interior filed reports against 5 persons for having committed a total of 82 criminal offences against intellectual property.

The State Attorney's Offices issued decisions against 31 perpetrators of criminal offences for the infringements of intellectual property rights, while criminal courts issued decisions against 19 accused persons.

2.2. Comprehensive course of action of a misdemeanour procedure in 2017

In 2017, 6,403 natural persons were accused of infringing the provisions of copyright and 75 persons of infringing the provisions of industrial property (infringements of trademark and industrial design), out of which 3,869 natural persons were found guilty of misdemeanour offences committed and were imposed sanctions (mostly fines).

In the same period, 4,100 legal and responsible persons were accused of infringing the provisions of copyright and 22 persons of infringing the provisions of industrial property (infringements of trademark and other indications), out of which 2,118 legal and responsible persons were found responsible and sentenced (also, mostly to fines).

Since the data for 2017 cannot be presented in a single table, table 2.1 was left out in this report.

3. CUSTOMS ADMINISTRATION – STATISTICAL DATA ON THE NUMBER OF INSTITUTED PROCEDURES, VALUE OF GOODS AND NUMBER OF PRODUCTS

For the purpose of presenting statistical data within the competence of the Ministry of Finance – Customs Administration, the statistical tables have been compiled on:

- the number of procedures and the number of provisionally detained goods, according to the product specifications (foodstuffs and beverages; body care products; clothes and clothing accessories; footwear; personal accessories; mobile phones, spare parts and accessories; electric/electronic and computer equipment; CDs, DVDs, cassettes and other data carriers; toys, games and sports equipment; tobacco products; medical products and other);
- the number of procedures according to the products specifications of provisionally detained goods and according to the outcome of procedures (destruction of goods as provisionally seized, taking of legal action before a competent court or stay of proceedings);
- the number of provisionally detained goods according to the products specifications and according to the outcome of procedures;
- the value of destroyed counterfeit goods according to the products specifications, expressed in EUR.

Customs Administration



- Customs Administration**



– Customs Administration



4. CUSTOMS ADMINISTRATION AND THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE – STATISTICAL DATA ON THE NUMBER OF INSPECTIONS CARRIED OUT AND THE NUMBER OF INDICTMENTS FOR INITIATING A MISDEMEANOUR PROCEDURE

Since 1 January 2014, the activities of the State Inspectorate relating to the enforcement of intellectual property rights, pursuant to the Act on Amendments to the Act on the Structure and Scope of Ministries and State Administration Organisations (OG 148/13), were assumed by the Ministry of Finance – Customs Administration.

Data for the period up to 2013 refer to the work of the State Inspectorate, and data on the inspection work of the Customs Administration in the internal market are given in separate tables (for 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017).

Data relating to the protection of copyright and related rights include the following:

- inspections relating to the protection of copyright in computer programs (the number of computers inspected, the number of illegally installed computer programs and the number of indictments served and misdemeanour warrants),
- inspections relating to the circulation of musical and cinematographic works recorded on audio and video carriers without the author's consent – the so-called pirated copies (the number of temporarily seized goods and their value, and the number of indictments served and misdemeanour warrants),
- inspections relating to the circulation and reproduction of books made without the author's and publisher's consent (the number of temporarily seized goods and their value, and the number of indictments served and misdemeanour warrants).

Data on the inspections carried out over the protection of industrial property include the following:

- inspections related to the circulation of products designated by a protected trademark without an authorisation of the trademark owner – counterfeits (the number of inspections, the number of temporarily seized goods and their value, and the number of indictments served and misdemeanour warrants),

- types and quantities of goods as temporarily seized for infringements of the trademark regulations,
- inspections related to the circulation of goods carried out according to a protected invention (the number of inspections, the number of temporarily seized goods and their value, and the number of indictments served and misdemeanour warrants),
- inspections related to the circulation of goods concerning the protection of industrial designs (the number of inspections, the number of temporarily seized goods and their value, and the number of indictments served and misdemeanour warrants),
- inspections related to the circulation of goods concerning the protection of geographical indication and designation of origin (the number of inspections, the number of temporarily seized goods and their value, and the number of misdemeanours).

Furthermore, upon abolishment of the State Inspectorate, competences regarding implementation of inspections over agricultural products and foodstuffs in the sector of winemaking and spirits protected by designation of origin and geographical indication in retail sale were assumed by inspections of the Ministry of Agriculture (Agricultural Inspection Department). Hence, this part of the report has a table 4.9.b with data on inspections over production and trade of agricultural products and foodstuffs protected by designation of origin and geographical indication, inspections over designations of origin and geographical indications in the winemaking sector and geographical indications in the spirits sector.

Data on the number of inspections carried out, the number of misdemeanours established and data on the number of indictments served and misdemeanour warrants issued are presented in the table.

As of 18 March 2015, the new Act on Agriculture (OG 30/2015) is in force. The protection of wine origin is provided by the Act on Common Organisation of the

Agricultural Products Market and on Specific Measures and Provisions Relating to the Agricultural Products Market (OG 82/2013, 14/2014 and 30/2015).

- Customs Administration



The value of temporarily seized audio and video carriers, expressed in EUR (data from the tables 4.3. and 4.3.a)



The value of temporarily seized goods for infringing the trademark provisions (data from the tables 4.5. and 4.5.a)





5. MINISTRY OF THE INTERIOR – DATA ON THE NUMBER OF CRIMINAL OFFENCES AND REPORTED PERSONS

Data have been presented concerning the number of criminal offences relating to the infringements of intellectual property rights, and the number of reported perpetrators of this type of criminal offences (up to 2010, data on the number of criminal reports as filed were monitored).

Since 1 January 2011, the statistical data on the number of criminal offences and the number of persons reported have been collected and monitored at the Ministry of the Interior, as well as the data on the number and type of temporarily seized goods in these criminal procedures.

With regard to the fact that the manner of collecting and recording of data by the Ministry of the Interior and the State Attorney's Office of the Republic of Croatia differs to a certain extent, the data provided by these two institutions are not completely comparable.

Where one person committed two or more criminal offences, he/she shall be entered in statistical tables of the Ministry of the Interior only once, and that for the most serious criminal offence.

When processing a criminal report as filed, the State Attorney's Office may in the continuation of processing make a legal prequalification of a criminal offence, which may also affect statistical recording and reporting.

- Ministry of the Interior



6. STATE ATTORNEY'S OFFICE – STATISTICAL DATA ON THE INFRINGEMENTS OF INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

For the purpose of presenting statistical data within the competence of the State Attorney's Office of the Republic of Croatia, the data have been presented in detail concerning the aggregate number of persons reported for criminal offences infringing the intellectual property rights, then data on the number of known offenders and the types of decisions made in these criminal cases by the state attorney's office, as well as the number of unknown perpetrators of the mentioned criminal offences.

Reports with the state attorney's offices have been directly filed by natural or legal persons, and by the Ministry of the Interior (MUP).

With regard to the fact that the manner of collecting and recording of data by the Ministry of the Interior and the State Attorney's Office of the RoC differs to a certain extent, the data provided by these two institutions are not completely comparable.

When processing a criminal report as filed, the State Attorney's office may in the continuation of processing make a legal prequalification of a criminal offence, which may also affect the statistical recording and reporting.

– State Attorney’s Office





















7. CRIMINAL COURTS AND MISDEMEANOUR' COURTS – DECISIONS

7.1. Criminal Law Sanctions

As regards the course of action of criminal procedure following the issue of an indictment brought by the State Attorney's Office, concerning the infringements of intellectual property rights, a presentation in detail is given of statistical data on the aggregate number of persons accused, the number of persons found guilty and of the types of decisions taken by criminal courts in cases persons were not found guilty, such as the number of suspensions of the criminal proceedings, the number of refusals, the number of acquittals and the number of persons not found guilty for being mentally incompetent.

The structure of criminal sanctions imposed in criminal procedures relating to the infringement of intellectual property rights has been presented. The statistical data have also been presented concerning the number of judicial proceedings in which offenders were imposed security measure of seizure of goods and material gain, as well as data concerning cost estimates of the fines imposed.

Note:

Data on the operation of criminal courts for 2017 delivered by the Ministry of Justice are given partly by the names of Articles from earlier wording of the Criminal Code (OG 110/97, 27/98 - rectification, 50/00 – Decision of the Constitutional Court of the RoC, 129/00, 51/01, 11/03, 190/03 – Decision of the Constitutional Court of the RoC, 105/04, 84/05 – rectification, 71/06, 110/07, 152/08 and 57/11) because criminal proceedings began at the time of this Code being valid, and partly by provisions of the new Criminal Code (OG 125/11, 144/12, 56/15, 61/15 and 101/17), in relation to the proceedings started according to this Code.

Types of decisions concerning all infringements of intellectual property rights in 2017 – Criminal courts













Unconditional imprisonments for criminal offences comprising infringements of copyright (aggregate data from the Tables 7.1.7. and 7.1.7.A)




Chart 7.1.8.
Conditional imprisonments for criminal offences comprising infringements of copyright (aggregate data from the Tables 7.1.7. and 7.1.7.A)






Chart 7.1.10.

(aggregate data from the Tables 7.1.8. and 7.1.8.A)















(aggregate data from the Tables 7.1.15. and 7.1.15.A)





7.2. Misdemeanour sanctions

As regards the course of action of a misdemeanour procedure, statistical data have been presented in detail on the aggregate number of the accused and persons found guilty or responsible for misdemeanours concerning the infringements of intellectual property rights, the number of suspensions of misdemeanour proceedings, including statute of limitations, and the number of protective measures imposed on misdemeanants.

The structure of sanctions imposed for committed misdemeanours has been presented, separately for natural persons and separately for legal and responsible persons.

Statistical data have also been presented concerning the amount of fines imposed for infringing the provisions in the field of intellectual property rights.

Note:

As of 2017, the methodology of reporting has been changed so that every defendant is statistically recorded for as many times as many misdemeanours he/she committed (every case or court procedure is recorded separately although the offender is the same).

Natural persons accused and found guilty for infringing the copyright law provisions, from 2008 to 2017



Legal persons accused and found responsible for infringing the copyright law provisions, from 2008 to 2017



Accused and found guilty for the infringements of the provisions on trademarks and other indications, from 2007 to 2017 (natural persons)



Legal persons accused and found responsible for infringements of the provisions on trademark and other indications, from 2008 to 2017







Chart 9.1.2.





Chart 9.2.2.

Duration of the procedure before commercial courts in 2017





Chart 9.3.2.
